All locations are within the Santa Clara Valley Open Space Authority's jurisdiction.

The primary program site for the Amigos Summer Under the Sun program is the ACE Empower Academy, 625 S Sunset Ave, San José 95116 located in District 6. This is identified as a Deep Engagement Community and an urban area within the Open Space Authority's jurisdiction. Activities will also occur at nearby community gardens, local parks and trails, and field trip locations (e.g., Veggielution Farm), which are also located within the Open Space Authority's jurisdiction.

More specifically, the Open Space Authority District(s) served by this program include: District 6 which encompasses the primary program site, the Mayfair and East San Jose neighborhoods, as well as the Amigos family shelter/housing program on N 13th St; District 3 which includes the Amigos' Tiny Homes family shelter and a family shelter/housing program on N 1st st in San Jose; and District 7 including the fourth Amigos family shelter / housing program on Old Tully Road.

The project serves primarily unhoused and low-income children and families from across Santa Clara County, especially those from East San Jose and Mayfair as that is the primary program site and one of the county's most under-resourced and environmentally burdened areas. According to the Latino Health Assessment, Latino residents experience the highest poverty rate (38%) and the lowest per capita income in the county. These economic challenges limit access to safe outdoor spaces, enrichment programs, and academic support, contributing to lower kindergarten readiness and long-term educational disparities. For families living with these compounded challenges, programs like Summer Under the Sun provide critical access to safe, nurturing, and educational environments that promote academic growth, mental well-being, and environmental health literacy. By centering the needs of the community, this project directly supports children and families who face systemic barriers to both educational success and healthy living.

## Project Abstract

Amigos de Guadalupe's Summer Under the Sun program is a five-week, thematic, hands-on summer learning experience for K–8 students in East San José. This year's theme, Earthkeepers/ Guardianes del Planeta, will focus on environmental education, climate resilience, and core academic skills through fun, place-based learning. Designed for low-income and unhoused children and youth, the program blends environmental stewardship, science exploration, math and literacy instruction, creative arts, and social-emotional learning so that students strengthen skills while connecting with nature around them. Students gain practical knowledge about the environmental world around them, local climate issues, and how to become environmental champions in their own way - while strengthening reading comprehension, writing, problem-solving, and numeracy through standards-aligned lessons. By equipping underserved youth with the knowledge and skills to protect their environment and succeed academically, Summer Under the Sun strengthens community climate resilience for generations to come.

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## Project Planning

### Describe the proposed project.

Summer Under the Sun is a five-week summer enrichment program serving K–8 students from low-income families in East San José and unhoused families across Santa Clara County. The 2026 theme, Earthkeepers / Guardianes del Planeta, is grounded in environmental justice and the lived experiences of our community. Students will explore neighborhood ecosystems, heat islands, air quality, water conservation, and local biodiversity, then translate their learning into action through waste-reduction projects, shade mapping, tree care, and pollinator studies. Field-based lessons and service projects make climate science tangible and relevant, emphasizing each student's agency: "I can protect my community, my home."

Hosted at ACE Empower Academy in East San Jose, with field trips to local gardens, Veggielution Community Farm, and other environmental education sites, the program integrates Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS) across literacy, math, and science. Academic learning is woven into environmental themes—students build reading comprehension through climate-focused texts, practice persuasive writing to advocate for sustainability, and apply math skills to real-world data collection and analysis. For example, students collect and graph data at home about their family's water use—counting how many people live in their household, how many showers they take, and how long they last—then compare their totals to city averages. These hands-on activities strengthen numeracy, data literacy, and environmental awareness while connecting classroom learning to everyday life.

The program runs from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., providing transportation from Amigos' family shelter and housing sites. Each day includes breakfast, lunch, and snacks, along with learning blocks dedicated to math, reading, science, social-emotional learning, arts, physical activity, outdoor play, and field trips - a highlight of the summer for many students!

The program is staffed primarily by Amigos' year-round Education Team, supplemented by contracted teachers and volunteers. Because many staff already know the students and families, the program builds on trusting relationships and supports trauma-informed, culturally responsive, two-generation approaches that center family voice and experience.

Throughout the five weeks, students track their growth in a personal Earthkeeper Passport, documenting investigations, data, reflections, and calls to action. The program culminates in a Week 5 Youth Showcase, where students present projects demonstrating their environmental knowledge, literacy, and leadership to families and community partners.

Since 2012, Summer Under the Sun has combined classroom learning, hands-on activities, and field trips to destinations such as the Monterey Bay Aquarium, San Francisco Zoo, Moss Landing Slough, and UC Santa Cruz's Seymour Marine Discovery Center. Past themes include Water is Life (water conservation) and We Are Growing Voters (civic engagement). The 2026 theme, Earthkeepers / Guardianes del Planeta, builds on this tradition to strengthen climate resilience in East San José by equipping children with environmental knowledge, academic skills, and a deep sense of belonging to the natural world. By removing barriers to cost and transportation, Amigos ensures that students who are often excluded from environmental education have the opportunity to learn, lead, and thrive—growing into the next generation of environmental stewards and community leaders.

**Describe key project deliverables and estimated completion dates.**

## Key Project Deliverables &amp; Timeline:

- Spring 2026 - Contracts/agreements for services signed, including ACE Empower Academy for program location, transportation services that will provide buses to transport enrolled children from family shelter sites to ACE Empower Academy, and a separate program contract/agreement to provide healthy meals.
- March-May 2026 - Curriculum developed by grade level for grades K–8 integrating climate resilience and academic skill-building and aligning with Common Core and NGSS standards.
- May 2026 - Additional Summer Under the Sun staff team hired (4 teachers + teacher aides)
- March-June 2026 - Outreach and enrollment completed for summer program participants, focused on family housing programs and the Mayfair / East San Jose community.
- June-July 2026 - High quality program provided to approximately 150 youth (with option to repeat Summer 2027). Tentative dates are June 8-July 17, 2026.
- June-July 2026, Weeks 1-5 program - Field trips provided to local environmental sites and/or guest speakers coordinated on wildlife / environmental topics (Veggielution, Moss Landing Slough, UC-Santa Cruz Seymour Marine Discovery Center, Monterey Bay Aquarium, Our City Forest, the "liquid zoo" from the Marine Science Institute, Mayfair Community Garden).
- Week 5 - Youth-led showcase of summer projects conducted, demonstrating both environmental knowledge and literacy skills.
- Fall 2026 - Evaluation and report on Summer Under the Sun program completed (student survey results, academic and environmental literacy).

No special permits are anticipated beyond the existing site use agreement with ACE Empower Academy. See Letter of Support from CEO of ACE Charter Schools that clearly describes that Amigos will be operating the Summer 2026 five-week summer program on the ACE Empower Academy school campus.

**What is the lifetime of this project? If applicable, describe plans for operating and maintaining the project in the future.**

N/A. It is also important to note that the Amigos Summer Under the Sun program has been operating every year since 2012 - with a different theme each year - and clearly has been operated, maintained, and successfully implemented across many years and serving 1,000+ children and youth. Curriculum and materials, including math and literacy lessons linked to environmental content, will be freely shared with partners and the public to extend impact.

**Describe the project's readiness for implementation.**

Amigos de Guadalupe has operated Summer Under the Sun annually since 2012 and thus, has the processes, systems, and relationships in place for ease of implementation each year. For example, Amigos has already secured commitment from the program site, has an enrollment portal ready to go, developed strong staff recruitment pipelines, (including staffing the program with 7 Amigos year-round Education team members), and has in place multiple community partnerships, including Veggielution, SCCOE, bus charter companies, Intern and Earn by CalWorks (for teacher's assistants), Mayfair community pool, and past successful guest speakers/activities, including the fan-favorite among the summer program students, the Marine Science Institute.

The Amigos team is prepared to begin conducting outreach and enrolling students living at our family shelter sites starting in March 2026. Amigos leadership will recruit and hire additional staff in Spring 2026, so that the Education Team is ready to finalize the environmental theme and curriculum by May 2026, in time for a successful launch of the summer program in June 2026. For the 2026 session, Amigos also intends to deepen its commitment to equitable access by incorporating credentialed educators with experience supporting neurodiverse learners and students with defined behavioral needs. This will ensure that students with IEPs or trauma-related behaviors can fully participate in the environmental curriculum with appropriate structure, sensory support, and tailored care.

Given Amigos' extensive experience running Summer Under the Sun for many years, many program components are already established and simply require updates for the 2026 summer session, including outreach materials and processes, the enrollment portal and application, site contracts and agreements, and lesson plan templates. In addition, specialized staff training modules will be integrated into pre-session preparations, equipping all summer educators with trauma-informed and inclusive instructional training so that the environmental lessons, activities, and group projects can be delivered in a safe, structured, and responsive learning environment for all students.

**Provide a brief budget narrative to explain the expenses listed in each of the budget categories (e.g. Personnel).**

We are requesting \$75,000 from the Open Space Authority to support staffing, transportation, field trips, and materials for the Summer 2026 Earthkeepers / Guardianes del Planeta program.

- Personnel: Summer teacher stipends / benefits for additional 4 staff with experience in K-8 math and literacy instruction and matching funds for staff time from 2 key staff, Director of Education and Education Program Manager.
- Contracted Services: Teacher aid stipends, to provide additional classroom support.
- Supplies/Materials include supplies to teach environmental topics such as hands-on science kits, garden supplies, art materials, and climate-themed books to support reading and writing, as well as healthy snacks for students. Note: daily breakfast and lunch will also be provided for all students through a school-affiliated program.
- Other Direct Costs: Daily school buses for 5 weeks to/from four family shelter sites and ACE Empower Academy summer program site and 2 field trip buses for 150 students + staff + funds for field trip admission fees/costs for 150 students.
- Indirect Costs at 20%: Administrative overhead

25% matching funds (through in-kind personnel) will include staff time for the Director of Education and Education Program Manager positions, both of whom provide overall program leadership as well as day-to-day on-site supervision and direct service.

Given that the largest components of this grant request are transportation costs (buses) and teacher stipends, this would mean 1) many students would likely not be able to attend the summer program consistently and on-time, thus disrupting the classroom flow and process, and 2) far fewer experienced teachers would be on-site to support a group of 150 high-needs children and youth.

The funding is also more critical this year than previous years as many of our previous funding sources have been cut, so the Urban Grant program is necessary for a successful Earthkeepers / Guardianes del Planeta summer program in 2026.

If awarded partial funding, Amigos may have to cancel the long-awaited field trips that these students otherwise would not be able to experience and is key to the model of providing access to environmental and open space opportunities for this particular group of low-income and unhoused children and youth.

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## Project Goals

**Describe the specific problems, issues, or unserved needs the project will address.**

East San José’s low-income and unhoused children and youth often lack access to safe outdoor environments, environmental learning opportunities, and affordable summer academic support. Many live in densely urbanized neighborhoods where nature feels distant or inaccessible. This summer program addresses these disparities by providing a nurturing, academically enriched, and environmentally focused summer experience that supports the whole child.

Many East San José children have not had the chance to explore the natural world that exists within their own community. Without regular exposure to outdoor environments, they miss the opportunity to understand the benefits of the natural world—both for their own well-being and for the health of the planet. Research shows that early experiences in nature foster environmental awareness and stewardship, laying the foundation for lifelong habits that sustain both communities and ecosystems. Without these formative experiences, children are less likely to see themselves as caretakers of the environment or to consider future academic or career pathways in related fields such as conservation, environmental science, or sustainability.

For children experiencing housing instability or economic stress, time in nature also offers profound mental health benefits. Studies demonstrate that outdoor learning and contact with green spaces can reduce anxiety, improve focus, and promote emotional regulation. For our participants, who often navigate extraordinarily stressful family situations, time spent outdoors provides both respite and a positive coping strategy they can carry into adulthood.

This program also responds to critical gaps in affordable summer enrichment. Many families cannot access structured, high-quality programs, creating both childcare challenges and income loss for caregivers and lost learning opportunities for students. By combining environmental education with literacy and math support, Summer Under the Sun combats summer learning loss while promoting academic confidence and curiosity as well as family well-being.

Finally, this program meets essential non-academic needs that schools typically provide—access to nutritious meals, caring adult mentors, and a safe, supervised, community environment. In doing so, it strengthens social-emotional skills, nurtures friendships, and promotes a sense of belonging. Together, these experiences empower East San José’s children and youth to thrive academically, emotionally, and environmentally—building resilience that benefits both their futures and the health of the communities they will one day lead.

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## Impact

Summer Under the Sun - Earthkeepers is a free, five-week summer program open to K–8 students from East San José. The Amigos Education team will develop an NGSS-aligned environmental curriculum, which will be made publicly available upon request. This model will be able to serve as a replicable example of how equitable access to outdoor learning can reduce academic disparities, improve mental health, and cultivate a generation of climate-conscious, community-minded leaders.

The program creates lasting impact by equipping East San José's low-income and unhoused children and youth with the knowledge, skills, and inspiration to become environmental stewards from a young age. Through lessons rooted in environmental science, climate action, and sustainability, students strengthen academic skills while building a meaningful connection to the natural world.

Research shows that time in nature improves concentration, reduces stress, and supports social-emotional well-being. Environmental education is also linked to higher academic achievement, stronger problem-solving skills, and greater motivation to learn. For children experiencing instability or trauma, building a relationship with the natural world provides vital opportunities for peace, emotional regulation, stress management, and resilience.

By engaging young people early in experiences centered around exploring local ecosystems, conservation projects, and learning how their actions affect the planet, they begin to see themselves as capable changemakers. As they learn to care for their environment, students also discover their own strengths and passions—whether in sustainability, conservation, animal care, or science—broadening their sense of what is possible for their futures. It helps youth recognize their capacity to make a difference in their community. For some, these experiences may become a first step toward a lifelong connection with nature and a sense of agency in shaping a more just and sustainable future.

The program's effects extend beyond individual participants. Students share what they learn with their families and neighbors, fostering a ripple effect of environmental awareness and stewardship across East San José and their shelter communities. In the long term, this program not only mitigates learning loss but also plants the seeds of environmental literacy, climate resiliency, leadership, and belonging—empowering young people to care for both the environment and themselves, strengthening the environmental and social fabric of the community for generations to come.

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## Climate Resilience

**How does this project enhance and/or raise awareness about climate resilience? Please include any metrics that can be used to help quantify or understand the climate benefits of the project.**

Summer Under the Sun / Earthkeepers enhances climate resilience by empowering East San José's children to understand, value, and actively care for their local environment. Through five weeks of NGSS-aligned, hands-on lessons, students learn how climate change affects their community and how everyday actions—such as conserving water, reducing waste, and protecting native habitats—contribute to a more sustainable future. The program builds not only knowledge but also agency, helping youth see themselves as part of the solution.

Students will participate in hands-on environmental action projects such as visiting the Veggielution Youth Garden and Farm, native planting, environmental walks, and/or waste audits. These activities both improve local ecosystems and make climate resilience tangible. Each activity reinforces how local environmental health is tied to global climate goals.

Metrics and outcomes include:

- Hours of environmentally focused learning: a daily minimum of 3 hours per student focused on environmental science and stewardship.
- Environmental actions completed: specific actions to be determined and included through the Common Core and NGSS-aligned curriculum design and development process.
- Knowledge and attitude gains: pre- and post-program surveys assessing environmental literacy, understanding of climate resilience, and confidence in taking environmental action.

By equipping children with climate knowledge, stewardship skills, and a sense of belonging in nature, Summer Under the Sun builds the next generation of leaders who will help shape a more just, resilient, and sustainable East San José.

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## Community Engagement / Stakeholder Support / Community Building

At Amigos de Guadalupe, community is at the heart of everything we do. Our work is guided by the principle that lasting change begins with those most impacted—our neighbors in East San José’s Mayfair community. For over a decade, Amigos has earned a deep and trusted reputation as a responsive, community-rooted organization. Families know that Amigos listens, acts, and stands alongside them in advancing educational equity, housing stability, community empowerment, and justice of all kinds - immigration justice, environmental justice, housing justice, etc.

Each spring, Amigos staff and Promotores conduct our annual “Walk n’ Talks” outreach campaign, knocking on more than 3,300 doors across Mayfair to connect directly with residents. These conversations (conducted in families’ preferred languages) inform our priorities, program design, and advocacy efforts. The insights gained through these visits ensure that programs like Summer Under the Sun are shaped by the voices and experiences of the community they serve.

Amigos also maintains ongoing, year-round engagement with hundreds of families through our education programs, including afterschool programs and educational navigation services at our four family housing shelter sites and a local East San Jose middle school. These relationships provide continuous feedback loops, allowing the Amigos Education Team to adapt programming in real time to meet evolving needs and interests.

Community partners have strongly endorsed this project as a natural extension of Amigos’ trusted leadership in the neighborhood. Letters of support from the Sí Se Puede Collective, ACE Empower Academy, the City of San Jose, the Santa Clara County Office of Education (in process), and County of Santa Clara Supervisor Betty Duong affirm broad-based community confidence in our capacity to deliver high-quality, inclusive environmental education programming that strengthens local resilience.

The Summer Under the Sun program reflects both the voices and aspirations of the community we serve: a safe, joyful, and enriching summer program opportunity for children to learn, lead, and connect with nature close to home. By centering community voice in design, implementation, and evaluation, Amigos ensures that every step of this project—from curriculum development to long-term impact—remains rooted in community trust, collaboration, and shared purpose.

This community-driven model aligns closely with the Open Space Authority’s Urban Grant Program priorities, which emphasize equitable access to nature, climate resilience, and locally led solutions. By grounding the program in resident input and long-standing partnerships, Amigos ensures that environmental education and access to open space are not just program outcomes—but expressions of community empowerment and environmental justice.

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## Underserved Communities

**Describe how the project addresses open space needs for sensitive populations such as residents of park-poor neighborhoods, under-served, or disadvantaged communities, youth, seniors, persons with disabilities, or is located within an under-resourced community.**

The Summer Under the Sun/Earthkeepers program directly serves children and youth from East San José's Mayfair neighborhood and surrounding communities, among the most under-resourced and park-poor areas in Santa Clara County. According to CalEnviroScreen 4.0, census tracts within East San José score in the 75th–95th percentile statewide for pollution burden and socioeconomic vulnerability, with high rates of hazardous waste effects, poor air quality, linguistic isolation, overcrowded housing, and limited access to safe, high-quality open spaces.

The Healthy Places Index data confirm these disparities, identifying East San José and Mayfair in the highest category for “less healthy community conditions” and is an area facing elevated environmental health risks, lower life expectancy, and limited proximity to parks compared to county averages. It is also important to note that Mayfair ranks extremely low in Education, at the lowest 2.2% across census tracts in California, further demonstrating the vital importance of the Summer Under the Sun program.

Likely all participating students will qualify for the National School Lunch Program (Title I), indicating low household income and systemic barriers to enrichment opportunities that include environmental education and access to open spaces. For many of these children - particularly those living in temporary housing or crowded apartments - Summer Under the Sun provides one of the few opportunities to spend sustained, structured time in safe, supervised settings and with the option for outdoor play in open spaces.

By offering free transportation, meals, and inclusive programming, Amigos eliminates financial and logistical barriers that often prevent low-income families from accessing environmental education. The program's design intentionally integrates environmental science, outdoor learning, and climate resiliency activities to both strengthen academic skills and foster a sense of belonging in community and the out-of-doors.

Through partnerships with Veggielution and the Youth Garden, local field trip sites, and other green spaces, the program gives children first-hand experiences with sustainable agriculture, water conservation, and environmental education opportunities, empowering them to become environmental stewards and future community leaders.

In addressing open space inequities, Summer Under the Sun transforms access to nature from a privilege into a right, advancing the Open Space Authority's mission of equitable access to outdoor learning, health, and climate resilience for all.

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## Organizational Capacity

Amigos de Guadalupe Center for Justice and Empowerment is a trusted anchor institution in San José and Santa Clara County, with over a decade of proven experience advancing educational opportunity, housing stability, and community empowerment for low-income and immigrant families. Rooted in the Mayfair neighborhood, Amigos operates on the core principle of centering community in all that we do—designing programs informed by direct resident engagement and feedback. Each year, Amigos staff and Promotoras conduct the annual “Walk n’ Talk” campaign, personally knocking on over 3,300 doors in the Mayfair area to hear directly from residents about their priorities and needs. This ongoing dialogue ensures that every initiative, including Summer Under the Sun, responds authentically to the community it serves.

Amigos has successfully operated Summer Under the Sun since 2012, offering a high-quality, themed academic and enrichment program for K–8 students. The program has grown steadily each year, serving students each summer through a combination of academic instruction, thematic-based projects, social-emotional learning, and field-based experiences. The Amigos Education Team brings extensive expertise with the community we serve and in curriculum design, literacy and math instruction, and designing curriculum to align with Common Core and other academic standards. Staff are youth development professionals with teaching experience who are also trained in trauma-informed care and culturally responsive pedagogy, ensuring students receive both academic and emotional support. Most importantly, Amigos staff come from the community we serve, helping to create strong connections with the young people in our program.

The program is managed by a dedicated Director of Education and Program Manager, who oversee implementation, curriculum design, staff training and support, logistics, partnerships, and reporting. Amigos’ collaborative model leverages strong relationships with the Sí Se Puede Collective, ACE Empower Academy, City of San Jose, the Santa Clara County Office of Education (letter in process), and the County of Santa Clara Supervisor Betty Duong, each of whom has provided letters of support for this project.

Financially, Amigos is a stable, well-managed nonprofit with a strong fiscal infrastructure and a funding base that includes foundation, corporate, individual, and government grants. The organization maintains rigorous financial oversight through its experienced Finance Team and has a demonstrated track record managing complex, multi-source grant funding.

With deep community trust, experienced educators, and a history of successful youth programming, Amigos de Guadalupe is well-positioned to implement this project effectively and sustainably—delivering measurable benefits for East San José’s children, families, and the environment.

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## Leadership & Innovation

The Summer Under the Sun Earthkeepers program represents an innovative model for advancing environmental education, climate resilience, and equity in one of Santa Clara County’s most under-resourced communities. Rather than treating environmental learning as an add-on, Amigos de Guadalupe integrates it directly into core academic instruction—connecting math, literacy, and science to hands-on environmental experiences aligned with Common Core and Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS). This approach ensures that environmental education not only fosters stewardship and climate awareness but also strengthens students’ academic skills and confidence.

The project’s innovation lies in the Amigos’s core principle of the 2-generation approach, serving the entire family with wraparound services, as well as a whole-child, community-embedded model. Each lesson is rooted in students’ lived experiences in East San José—helping them see how issues like air quality, heat islands, and water conservation directly impact their neighborhood and daily lives. By combining environmental science with social-emotional learning, art, and civic engagement, the program nurtures environmental literacy alongside mental health, resilience, and belonging. This integrated framework transforms access to open space and environmental learning into a tool for both academic success and community empowerment.

“Radical Hospitality” is a core component of the innovative Amigos model. This approach emphasizes creating an environment where every participant feels welcomed, valued, and part of a caring community. It ensures that children and families - particularly those who are often marginalized, including immigrants and unhoused youth - feel seen, heard, and supported. In the context of Summer Under the Sun, Radical Hospitality extends to the program’s design and delivery: the Amigos Education Team invests significant time, energy, and care throughout the school year to build meaningful relationships with the students who will participate in the summer program. By grounding the program in trust and connection, Amigos fosters a safe, nurturing space that enhances learning, engagement, and long-term community belonging.

Collaboration is at the heart of the project. Amigos’ leadership in the Sí Se Puede Collective ensures alignment with trusted neighborhood partners, including specific collaboration in Summer Under the Sun activities for students with Veggielution and the School of Arts and Culture at the Mexican Heritage Plaza, amplifying impact through shared resources and outreach. Partnerships with ACE Empower Academy, the Santa Clara County Office of Education, and the Office of Supervisor Betty Duong extend the program’s reach and reinforce its sustainability.

Amigos’ community-driven design process is another hallmark of innovation. As mentioned previously, staff and volunteers go door-to-door in Mayfair to engage residents in dialogue about local needs and opportunities. This direct feedback continually shapes the summer curriculum, ensuring it reflects families’ values and aspirations while building community trust and ownership.

Ultimately, Summer Under the Sun Earthkeepers demonstrates leadership by reimagining what equitable environmental education can look like in urban settings—bridging academic learning, open space access, and climate resilience through partnerships that center the voices of East San José’s children and families.




