The Feast will take place on Saturday, September 19, from 11:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., at the newly-opened Coyote Valley Open Space Preserve in Morgan Hill. Coyote Valley will come alive with a festival of music, dancing, live animals, games, and guided hikes. The Harvest Feast will provide an abundance of lively entertainment for the whole family, including ABC-KGO Anchor Dan Ashley as MC, kids' entertainer Andy Z, and several local performance groups representing diverse cultures. Chef Erica Schaal will demonstrate how to prepare her signature paella dish and will share free samples.
